










Archaeology park and museum Espace Paul Vouga CH – 2068 Hauterive

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Set in an idyllic place on the shore of Lake Neuchâtel, with a panoramic view of the Alps, the Laténium invites you to interact with the past. Through the permanent exhibition, immerse yourself in the stories told by over 3000 objects, ranging from the Middle Ages back to the Neandertal period. Designed for visitors of all ages the Laténium highlights the most recent archaeological research in both its permanent and temporary exhibitions. Thanks to interactive devices you can experience scientific methods: excavation, dating, preservation, restoring, ...

The park surrounding the museum retraces the evolution of the landscape on the shores of Lake Neuchâtel from the glacial periods up to the present day. A camp of Palaeolithic hunters, pile-dwelling houses, megalithic tombs, menhirs, a Celtic bridge and a Gallo-Roman shipwreck offer visitors the opportunity to discover the techniques and monumental achievements of the populations which lived before us and to question the relationships between human groups and their environment.

The Laténium aims to make culture accessible to everybody. It is the first museum in Western Switzerland to be awarded the title "Culture inclusive", which acknowledges the commitment of cultural institutions to all the visitors, providing an easy access to those with disabilities.

The Laténium, winner of the Council of Europe
Museum Prize, hosts the largest collection of
objects discovered at the Celtic site of La Tène
after which it is named. The Laténium is also a
major interpretation centre of the pile-dwellings,
the prehistoric lakeshore villages inscribed on
the list of the UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

The Laténium is located in Hauterive, on the shore of Lake Neuchâtel (3 km from Neuchâtel town centre).


By car: parking at the port at Hauterive (fee charged)


